Communicating Cybersecurity: Consistently inconsistent?

The talk will focus on the need for cybersecurity awareness for end users (in workplace and personal contexts), and the varying effectiveness of what is on offer (in terms of both the attempts to support them at all, and then the consistency of the advice being offered).

Short bio:

Steven Furnell is professor of cyber security at the University of Nottingham. He is also an Honorary Professor with Nelson Mandela University (South Africa) and an Adjunct Professor with Edith Cowan University (Western Australia). His research interests include security awareness and culture, usability of security and privacy, and technologies for user authentication and intrusion detection. He has authored over 340 papers in refereed international journals and conference proceedings, as well as numerous books and book chapters. Professor Furnell is the current Chair of Technical Committee 11 (security and privacy) within the International Federation for Information Processing, and a board member of the Chartered Institute of Information Security.

Judy van Biljon holds the National Research Foundation's Chair in Information and Communication for Development (ICT4D) hosted by the School of Computing at the University of South Africa (Unisa). She holds a Ph.D. in Computer Science from Unisa, and an M.Ed. from the North-West University. She has contributed to the body of academic knowledge by publishing on Human-Computer Interaction evaluation and design for marginalised groups, technology adoption, and sustainability in digital learning for resource-constrained environments. She promotes research capacity building through initiatives such as the establishment of the Southern African Chapter of the International Network for Postgraduate Students in ICT4D (IPID). Currently she serves as Associate Editor of Information Technology for Development and as a Senior Editor of the Electronic Journal of Information Systems in Developing Countries.
